MINUTES Council Meeting February 6, 2024, Page 1

Mayor Jung was absent from the meeting. Mrs. Scarpellini made a **motion** to make Mr. Jeff Riddle Mayor Pro-tem for the meeting; the **motion** was seconded by Mr. Middleton. The **motion** passed unanimously 6-0.

A Council meeting of the Douglass Hills City Council was called to order by Councilperson Riddle at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, February 5, 2025. Members of the Council were Jeff Riddle, Denise Scarpellini, Bill Middleton, Patti Eubanks, Neil Sandefur, Matthew Nelson, City Attorney John Singler, City Clerk Clay Porter and City Treasurer Holly Sanford, were also in attendance. Public Works Director Burke Davis was absent from the meeting.

<u>OFF DUTY POLICE-</u> Mr. Darrell Spurgeon reported that there have been reports of car breakins in Douglass Hills. Mr. Spurgeon encouraged citizens to file police reports with the LMPD 8th Division to increase police patrols within Douglass Hills.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of December 5, 2024, the City Council meeting were put on the table. Mr. Middleton made a motion to accept the minutes; seconded by Mrs. Eubanks. The motion passed unanimously 6-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. Sandefur moved to accept **November 2024** Treasurer's report: seconded by Mrs. Scarpellini. The **motion** passed unanimously 6-0.

Mr. Nelson moved to accept **December 2024** Treasurer's report: seconded by Mrs. Scarpellini. The **motion** passed unanimously 6-0.

<u>PUBLIC WORKS REPORT</u> Burke Davis absent from the meeting. Mr. Riddle reported that crews worked for over 200 hours plowing and salting roads in Douglass Hills. The city laid down 70 tons of salt. The cost of the last snow event was roughly \$23,000. Mr. Riddle reported few complaints other that snow blocking the ends of the driveways and mailboxes.

GUEST SPEAKERS-Mrs. Grace Simrall and Mr. Darren Stout with Lumos Fiber spoke regarding a franchise agreement with Douglass Hills. Lumos Fiber would like to install underground fiber optic lines in the right-of-way in Douglass Hills. Lumos Fiber currently has franchise agreements with Louisville Metro, City of Middletown and other Home Rule Cities in Jefferson County. Lumos Fiber proposes installing flush mounted underground boxes throughout the city. Representatives stated that there will be no above ground boxes installed within the municipal boundaries of Douglass Hills. Representatives believed that this process would take approximately sixty days to complete. City residents will be updated by Lumos Fiber via door hangers, emails and a project tracker. Lumos Fiber will repair any damage including reseeding

grass, sidewalks and street. According to the representatives any complaints will be resolved in up to five business days. Lumos Fiber representatives will be sending the City Clerk photographs and videos of past projects to share with the City Council and citizens.

SAFETY COMMITTEE- NONE

TREE COMMITTEE- Mr. Morgan Herndon and Mrs. Lynn Carrie reported that the Tree Committee is getting estimates to treat trees on Kirkham Road for ash bores and fertilization.

RECREATION COMMITTEE- Mr. Sandefur spoke about the shade for the swimming pool, drainage and tennis courts being completed by this spring. Mr. Sandefur reported that the Recreation Committee reviewed the revenue and expense report for the swimming pool. The Recreation Committee advised the City Council to increase the pool rates for 2025. Mr. Sandefur reported that the Recreation Committee will be looking for a new Event Coordinator to replace Mrs. Jennie Norfleet. Mr. Sandefur reported that the job description will be advertised soon.

<u>PLANNING & ZONING COMMITTEE</u> -Mr. Jeff Riddle reported that the Planning and Zoning Committee have not met recently.

<u>COMMENTS FROM CITIZENS-</u> Mrs. Janet Mattingly voiced concern over the rumble strips that have been placed in front of her house on Gatehouse Lane. Mrs. Mattingly stated that she believes that the noise from the rumble stripes could decrease the value of her property. Mrs. Mattingly spoke about the City Council saying that there is a six-month review on the rumble strips. She requested that the City Council vote on whether to remove or replace the rumble strips.

MAYOR JUNG'S REPORT-

- Mr. Jeff Riddle reported that the remaining ARPA money has been allocated by the City
 of Douglass Hills for refurbishing the tennis courts and additional swimming pool shade.
- Mr. Riddle reported few complaints other that snow blocking the ends of the driveways and mailboxes. Snow removal cost approximately \$23,000 with 70 tons of salt spread around the city.
