#### "Branching Out" from the Douglass Hills Tree; Committee

Last month we summarized Paul Cappiello's article regarding the December cold snap. He followed it with a January 15th article giving specifics for some of our area's favorite specimens:

Broadleaf Evergreens: These are the ones with obvious visual damage simply because their evergreen leaves are now sporting a new shade of brown. Wait before lopping off what you think is dead; give it a chance for regrowth.

<u>Holly Plants</u>: Interestingly, some hollies look damaged while others survived and that is simply because we have multiple varieties in Kentucky. It is recommended that you wait until the new growth starts in late May to determine the dead areas that need pruned away. The good news is that hollies will likely bounce back quickly.

Nandina Plants: It appears that these plants really suffered from the cold—losing their showy fruit and stems. This Spring, examine your plant and prune away the dead areas. But if the plant is severely damaged, Paul recommends cutting it all the way to the ground knowing that you'll lose this year's flowers and fruit while investing in your plant's future.

<u>Cherry Laurel</u>: Again, wait until you actually see the plant leafing out and then remove the damage. If your plant has died back nearly to the ground and regrowth isn't visible this Spring, cut it all the way back to the ground to entice new regrowth.

<u>Crepe Myrtle</u>: These likely have stem damage and dieback too. Using hand pruners, individually cut back the damaged stems. Then step away and assess how to reshape the Crepe Myrtle given what was removed.

Flowering Dogwoods: Let's end on a good note! Paul suggests that this may be the "Miracle Flowering Dogwood Year." The cold snap may cause 2-petal white blooms instead of the normal 4-petal blooms. So for dogwoods—let's just wait and see how they impress us this spring.

Bottom line is the same takeaway—we are urged to <u>wait</u> and observe before pruning.

## WILD LIGHTS: AROUND THE WORLD TICKETS ON SALE

Featuring New Lanterns Inspired by Unique Global Sites

The Louisville Zoo is excited to announce the return of one of the largest lantern festivals in the nation, **Wild Lights: Around the World**, March 10 through May 21, 2023. Tickets will be on sale at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, February 1 at <a href="louisvillezoo.org/wildlights">louisvillezoo.org/wildlights</a>.

With an almost entirely new lineup of lanterns, guests will be able to see sights from around the world on their 1.4mile excursion through the Zoo. Famous landmarks, flora and fauna from North and South America, Africa, Europe, Australia and Asia will be highlighted in six different zones. As families venture through the Zoo's pathways each evening, they will experience hand-crafted, illuminated art displays comprised of silk-covered, metal frames and LED lightbulbs. The event will feature over 50,000 LED lightbulbs, 18 interactive displays, 8 animated lanterns and 10 light changing pieces that together present a spectacular feast for the eyes. A few lantern highlights include a walk-through cobra corridor, giant blue morpho butterfly, and a 9-foot, shark-themed photo opportunity. Other lanterns to look forward to include the Statue of Liberty, Sydney Opera House, Leaning Tower of Pisa, Hall of Supreme Harmony and so much more!

This 46-night immersive experience features live cultural performances including Chinese folk dances, acrobatics and more. There will also be unique handcrafted goods available for purchase along with snacks and cocktails by Service Systems Associates (SSA) – the Zoo's food and amenity vendor.

Wild Lights is in partnership with Stewart Promotions and Tianyu Arts & Culture Inc., an international event design company.

The event is wheelchair and stroller-friendly on a paved path. The festival is a rain or shine event and will be held 6:30 – 10 p.m. Thursday through Sunday nights from March 10 – May 21, 2023 and nightly from March 30 – April 9, 2023.

#### **PRICING**

Early Bird pricing available March 10 – 31, 2023. General admission is \$20, Louisville Zoo members receive \$17 discounted admission. Children 2 and under are free and do not require a ticket. Family Four Pack tickets are available for \$65; Zoo members may purchase the Family Four Pack at a discounted rate of \$55. Family Four Pack ticket holders must enter the event together. Tickets are available for purchase in advance online only.

From April 1 – May 21, 2023, General admission is \$22, Louisville Zoo members receive \$19 discounted admission. Children 2 and under are free and do not require a ticket. Family Four Pack tickets are available for \$75; Zoo members may purchase the Family Four Pack at a discounted rate of \$65. Family Four Pack ticket holders must enter the event together. Tickets available for purchase in advance online only.

#### **SCAM PREVENTION IS AN AROUND-THE-CLOCK JOB**



National Consumer Protection Week is coming soon (March 5–11), making this a good time to offer you a few tips to help protect your LG&E account from criminals. Unfortunately, scammers never take a break, so it's crucial to be aware of some of their tricks.

#### LG&E will **NEVER**:

- Make a live phone call to demand payment.
- Contact you to get personal information such as credit/debit card numbers or checking account information.
- Send a representative to your home to demand payment.
- Ask you to make a payment with a prepaid debit/gift card or a payment app.

• Tell you your service will be cut off if you do not make an immediate payment.

If you ever get a call, email or text claiming to come from LG&E and demanding immediate payment, it's a scam. If you suspect the request is not legitimate, you have a few options to easily check your account status.

- Sign in to the free mobile app. (If you don't have it, scan the QR code in this newsletter.)
- 2. Sign in to My Account (my.lge-ku.com).
- Call our automated phone system at 502-589-1444 (800-331-7370 outside Louisville) and press 1-2-1.

Every year April through October, we inspect natural gas lines up to your meter to look for leaks or damage. Your home or business will have such an inspection once every three years. #### **DON'T GET BURNED**: HOT WATER SAFETY IS A MUST FOR AVOIDING SERIOUS INJURY



It would be almost impossible to live without hot water, but safety precautions are a must to avoid potentially serious burns. For example, it's very easy to get scalded in the bath or shower if your water is too hot.

Avoid danger and pain with just a few simple steps.

• Have a plumber install anti-scald devices on faucets and showerheads to keep the water temperature from going above 120 degrees Fahrenheit.

- Check the temperature setting on your gas water heater and make sure it is no higher than 120 degrees Fahrenheit. A temperature of 125 degrees can scald a child within three seconds.
- Always check bath water with your hand before putting a child in the tub.
- Turn cold water on before turning on the hot water and turn hot water off before turning off cold water.
- Make certain faucets are correctly labeled HOT and COLD.


